

Preschool crafts Day 1 (Bible Story: Seeing God in Creation Romans 1:20) (Binoculars)

What do I need: empty toilet paper tubes (2 per child), tape, yarn or string, stickers, markers

How to make Craft:

- 1) Tape two toilet paper tubes together side by side (wrap the tape around both tubes on both ends) to create binoculars.
- 2) Cut a two-foot length of yarn for each set of binoculars.
- 3) Decorate the binoculars with stickers or markers.
- 4) Let the kids look through the binoculars to see what God has made



Preschool Crafts Day 2 (Bible Story: The Wise and Foolish Builders Matthew 7:24-27) (Building a house)

What do I need: Popsicle sticks, broken popsicle sticks, Construction paper, sandpaper, grey tissue paper, glue stick

How to make craft: Use the popsicle sticks to make a house. Underneath that house place your grey tissue paper. Then for the fallen house place your broken popsicle sticks altogether. Then glue underneath the piece of sandpaper.



*Note: Yes, the popsicle sticks are meant to be broken

Preschool Crafts Day 3 (Bible Story: Salvation; The Gospels)

What You Need: "Camera" and "Story Strip" activity pages, colored pencils or crayons, scissors

What You Do: slits on the dotted lines of the lens are of the camera to allow a strip to fit through. Encourage children to color their story strip and camera. Help insert the story strip into the camera and show the kids how to slide it side to side to see the story.

Preschool Crafts Day 4 (Bible Story: The Greatest Commandment Matthew 22:36-40; 1 Corinthians 13)

What do I need: paper plates (one per child); a pencil; scissors; heart stickers or heart stamps; crayons or markers; yarn

How to make the craft:

- 1) On a paper plate, starting at the outer edge, draw a two-inch-wide spiral into the center of the plate with a pencil. This line marks where the plate will be cut after decorating to create the spiral.
- 2) Cut the yarn into 12-inch lengths. You will need one per child.
- 3) Once children are finished decorating, use the scissors to cut along the pencil line on the plate to create a spiral.
- 4) Tape one end of the yarn to the top of the spiral



Extra Craft!

Paper towel rolls and/or toilet paper rolls, Paper plates, Duct tape, Marbles, Scissors

How to make the craft: Set out all supplies, tell kids to design and build a series of towers, ramps, and loops that marbles can roll through encouraging them to create the most unique track possible for their marbles, let kids test their designs to see if marbles can make their way through the entire thing. Allow kids to play with their creations
